I Ain't Skeered

By now I'm sure that you know about my wife Patti's transplant surgery. In fact, in anticipation of that surgery, I am writing this article for our church newsletter several weeks earlier since our secretary, Dolores, will be editing and printing the June newsletter about the time that our family will be spending much of our time at the hospital and then recovering at home. But thinking about this surgery caused me to remember and reflect on my feelings, and some of the questions that I had, seventeen years ago when Patti had her first transplant, and later for a few other significant health issues.

The biggest question was, "Aren't you afraid?" And, honestly, my best answer was, and is, "No." Even before I started down the path of becoming a pastor, I had put my faith and trust in a magnificent creator God, and his redeemer and rescuer son, Jesus. I admit to feeling stress about schedules, homework assignments, and the possibilities that things might somehow go wrong. I'm human. I do worry. I worry about Patti, I worry about her quality of life, I worry about Jonah and his future life with one kidney.

But beyond those things, I trust. I trust that the God who brought Patti and I together is smarter, wiser, and far more powerful that I can imagine. I trust that this amazing God loves me, as he demonstrated by the stories of scripture and by sacrifice of his only son for our rescue. I trust that the God who brought us through unemployment, the adoption of our children, our call to ministry, then a career change, seminary, several changes of church appointments, several surgeries, Patti's near fatal dance with COVID-19, and a host of other frightening adventures, will bring us through this one.

Does that mean that Patti's full recovery is guaranteed? No, of course it doesn't. If that were true, she never would have been diabetic, or developed kidney disease, or needed a transplant (let alone a second one). Life doesn't always turn out the way we want it to turn out. God isn't a genie in a bottle and doesn't answer all our prayers. But God has been with us through so much, I trust that God will give me the strength to endure whatever lies ahead. I pray that Patti will recover well, and that we get to keep her for another 20 years or so. I pray that Jonah lives a long and happy life with one kidney. But I trust God for whatever happens.

In situations like this, I have often seen social media post like, "God never gives you more than you can handle." But that's not true. The Bible never says that. Ever. In fact, if we pay attention, the stories of scripture often say the opposite. The Moses got so much grief from the people of Israel that he cried out to God and said, "Why have you brought this trouble on your servant? What have I done to displease you that you put the burden of all these people on me? Did I conceive all these people? Did I give them birth? Why do you tell me to carry them in my arms, as a nurse carries an infant, to the land you promised on oath to their ancestors? ...I cannot carry all these people by myself; the burden is too heavy for me. If this is how you are going to treat me, please go ahead and kill me..."

Elijah, one of the greatest prophets that ever lived, was so afraid of King Ahab and Queen Jezebel, that he "ran for his life. When he came to Beersheba in Judah, he left his servant there, ⁴ while he himself went a day's journey into the wilderness. He came to a broom bush, sat down under it, and prayed that he might die. "I have had enough, Lord," he said. "Take my life; I am no better than my ancestors." ⁵ Then he lay down under the bush and fell asleep."

It isn't that God won't give us more than we can handle, God often does exactly that. But God doesn't want us to give up, God wants us to surrender ourselves and ask for his help. God wants us to trust

him and to rely upon him for strength when life demands more from us than we have within ourselves. When God gives us more than we can handle, he trusts that, together, we can get through it. I know that this is true. Patti and I have lived through difficult things more than once. And honestly, sometimes I wish that God didn't trust me to handle things as much as does.

In the end...

I don't know what the future holds.

But I know who holds the future.

I ain't skeered. (translation: I'm not scared)
I am at rest in the hands of a faithful God.

GOOD TO KNOW:

The Vision of United Women in Faith is, turning faith, hope, and love into action on behalf of women, children, and youth around the world. What better way to act on this Vision then to support a local agency like the Alliance YWCA that advocates directly for women and children.

Recently, the YWCA acquired an additional Transitional Housing location on Union Avenue, now called *Donna Jean's House*. There is a great need in the Alliance community for transitional housing, especially for women and children. United Women in Faith, recognizing this need and the capability of the YWCA to perfectly fill it, decided we needed to support this critical initiative.

United Women in Faith decided to utilize the Martha and Leonard Goldrick Fund to support the YWCA in its pursuit of providing Transitional Housing. This fund was so generously provided by the Goldrick's to support women and children locally and globally. A donation of \$15,000 is being given

directly to the YWCA to support needed renovations of Donna Jean's House. A plaque to honor the Goldrick's will be placed in the house. Another \$15,000 is being used to establish a Greater Alliance Foundation endowed fund, the YWCA Transitional Housing Fund, to be used to sustain YWCA Transitional Housing programs in the Alliance area now and in the future. More information to come on how you can support this fund.

We can't say THANK YOU enough to Martha and Leonard Goldrick for letting United Women in Faith extend the hands of extravagant generosity to the world! Their generosity is and will continue to change lives!
